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Crack repair projects scheduled to start Sept. 25 in Pawnee and Stafford counties

Crack repair projects are scheduled to start Sept. 25 in Pawnee and Stafford counties.

The projects are on U.S. 281 from the U.S. 50 junction north to the K-19 junction in Stafford County; K-19 from the Pawnee/Stafford county line east to the U.S. 281 junction in Stafford County; and K-19 from the K-19 spur to the Pawnee/Stafford county line in Pawnee County. The project covers just more than 33 miles.

Scodeller Construction Inc. of Wixom, Wisconsin, is the primary contractor for the \$161,633 project. Scodeller has 35 working days and 10 cleanup days for the project. Traffic will be controlled by a flagging and pilot car operation.

The Kansas Department of Transportation urges all motorists to be alert, obey the warning signs and "Give 'Em a Brake!" when approaching and driving through a highway work zone.
