Asphalt Overlay on US-160 Highway in Sumner and Cowley Counties

Starting around Monday, May 5, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will begin an asphalt surface recycle and overlay project on US-160, from the east city limits of Wellington in Sumner County continuing east 19 miles to the west city limits of Winfield in Cowley County.

Traffic through this work zone will be controlled by flagmen and pilot car, so drivers can expect delays of up to 15 minutes. The work area will move daily and work will be underway during daylight hours only. There will be a 12 foot width restriction in the work zone, so vehicles with widths wider than 12 feet will need to use an alternate route. This project is scheduled to be completed by August, depending on delays caused by adverse weather conditions.

APAC – Kansas Inc., Shears Division from Hutchinson is the prime contractor for this \$3,113,545.63 project, which is funded by T-WORKS, the transportation program passed by the Kansas Legislature in May 2010.
