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Survey to begin on K-14 Highway in Kingman County

Starting around Tuesday, June 9, and continuing for three (3) weeks, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will have a field survey team surveying a section of K-14 highway in Kingman County. The survey area will include the section of K-14 highway approximately 1500 feet south and 1500 feet north of the K-14 bridge over Hunter Creek located approximately three (3) miles south of the City of Kingman. The purpose of the survey is to gather information necessary to create detailed designs for future highway improvements.

Michael Selley, P.S., Field Survey Project Manager, will be in charge of this survey for KDOT. A member of the survey crew will contact landowners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey equipment on the ground to determine locations on existing features within the survey corridor.
