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## K-14 bridge between Sterling, Lyons to be replaced

Work is expected to start around Oct. 17 on a \$4.3 million replacement of a K-14 bridge in Rice County.

The Kansas Department of Transportation project involves the Cow Creek drainage bridge 9.7 miles north of the Reno County line -- between Sterling and Lyons. The work also will include grading and surfacing.

The construction is expected to be completed around the end of June 2023.


The new bridge will be built just off the existing K-14 alignment. Motorists will continue to use the existing bridge during the project.

During the work, motorists will be directed to drive at a reduced speed through the work zone. Later in the project, traffic will be restricted to one lane and controlled by traffic signals.

King Construction Co. Inc. and Subsidiaries, of Hesston, is the primary contractor for the \$4,321,593 project.
