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K-14 patching to start soon in Reno County

Work will begin soon on a nearly \$3.6 million patching project on K-14 in Reno County.

The Kansas Department of Transportation project will be from the west K-14/U.S. 50 junction north to Yaggy Road. The length is almost 7 miles.

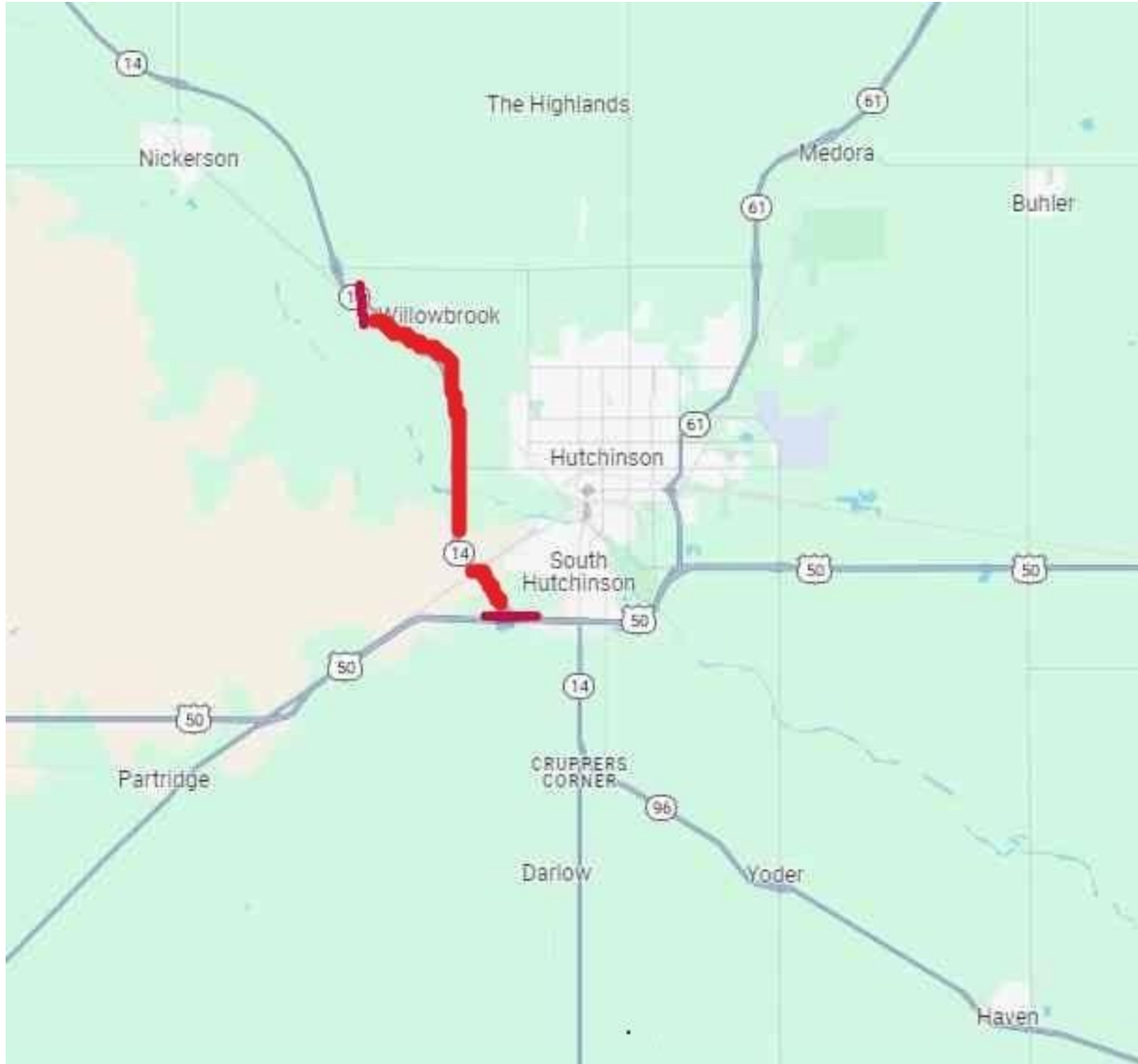
The work is expected to start around March 18 and be completed around mid-August.

During the work, traffic will be restricted to one lane and controlled by flaggers or a pilot car. Ramps eventually will be closed at times. Motorists should be prepared to slow down and stop and face delays of up to 15 minutes.
