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U.S. 160 resurfacing west of Wellington to begin soon

Work will start soon on a nearly \$4.5 million resurfacing on U.S. 160 in Sumner County.

The Kansas Department of Transportation project involves milling and a hot-mix-asphalt overlay. The resurfacing will be from the Harper/Sumner county line east to the west city limits of Wellington. The length is about 21.5 miles.

The work is expected to begin around March 25 and be completed around early June.

During the work, traffic will be restricted to one lane and controlled by flaggers and a pilot car. Motorists should be prepared to slow down and stop and face delays of up to 15 minutes.
