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U.S. 166 guardrail project in Sumner County to begin soon

Work is expected to start around April 1 on U.S. 166 guardrail replacement in Sumner County.

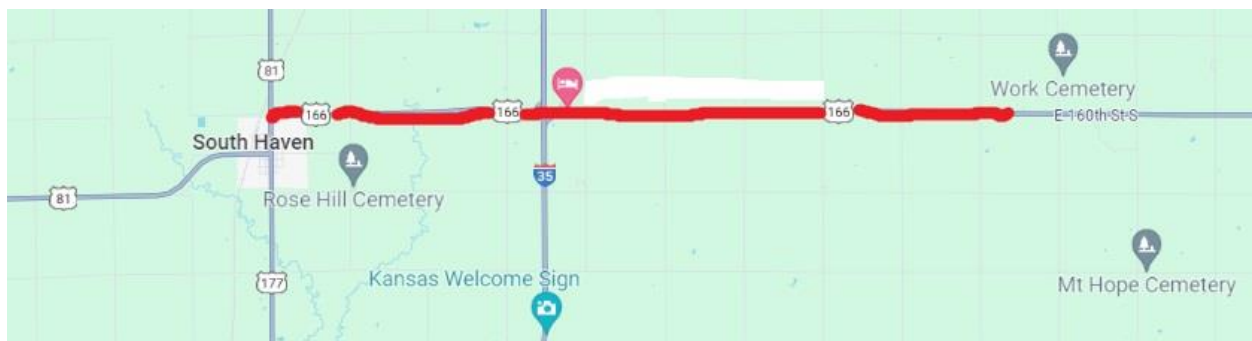
The Kansas Department of Transportation project will be on U.S. 166 from the U.S. 81/166 junction at South Haven east for about 9 miles. The project location extends east to east of South Rock Road.

During the work, expected to be completed around mid-June, traffic in the work zone will be controlled by flaggers during daylight hours. During the flagging operation, motorists should be prepared to slow down and stop and expect delays of up to 15 minutes.
