# Concrete Patching work on US-77 Highway from Arkansas City to the Oklahoma State Line

Starting around Monday, June 1, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will begin a concrete pavement patching project on US-77 Highway in Cowley County near Arkansas City. The concrete pavement patching will begin on the US-77 bypass in Arkansas City between Summit Street and Madison Avenue and this section of US-77 will be closed approximately two (2) weeks for concrete pavement replacement adjacent to the railroad overpass. This section of the US-77 bypass will be detoured onto Summit Street and Kansas Avenue while this repair work is underway.

~~Approximately two weeks later~~ **Tuesday, June 9** concrete pavement patching will begin on the section of US-77 from the Oklahoma state line continuing north to the Arkansas River bridge located at the south city limits of Arkansas City. This four lane section of US-77 will have one lane in each direction open at all times during this two (2) week project.

Starting around **Monday, July 13**, after all concrete pavement patching is complete, these sections of US-77 will receive an asphalt overlay.

APAC Kansas Inc. Shears Division from Hutchinson is the prime contractor for this \$1,957,624.87 project, which is funded by T-WORKS, the transportation program passed by the Kansas Legislature in May 2010.
