Pavement testing in Kingman and Reno counties to begin

Pavement testing on K-61, K-14 and K-2 in Kingman and Reno and counties will begin Monday, Aug. 7. The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) conducts these pavement tests annually on different highway segments, using a Falling Weight Deflectometer (FWD), a device equipped with a series of weights that checks the strength of asphalt pavement. The project is scheduled to be completed, weather permitting, on Thursday, Aug. 10.

The pavement strength tests will affect the following routes:

- Kingman County
 - K-2 from Kingman/Harper county line east to the K-42/K-2 junction
- Reno County
 - K-61 from U.S. 50/K-61 junction south to the north city limits of Arlington
 - K-14 from K-96/K-14 junction south to K-17/U.S. 54 junction

The testing crew will be using a lane closure operation to control traffic through the pavement test sections in Kingman and Reno counties during daylight hours only. The outside lane will be closed while testing is performed. The inside lane will remain open. KDOT urges drivers to be alert, pay attention to all work zone warning signs, slow down when approaching a work zone and be prepared to stop.
