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## Project to resurface 17-mile section of K-49 in Sumner County

Work is expected to begin around April 5 on a \$2.5 million project to resurface a 17-mile section of K-49 in Sumner County.

The Kansas Department of Transportation project involves a mill and hot-mix-asphalt overlay on K-49 from Avenue A in Caldwell north to the U.S. 160 junction.


During the work, traffic will be restricted to one lane and controlled by a pilot car and flaggers during daylight hours. Motorists should be prepared to slow down and stop and face a delay of up to 15 minutes. There is a 10-foot width limit.

The project is expected to be completed around late May.
