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K-101 chip seal begins July 9

Monday, July 9, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) expects to begin a project to place a chip seal on K-101 in Labette County. The 10-mile project will seal the entire length of K-101 from the U.S. 166 junction north to U.S. 160, including the roadway located within the Edna city limits.

Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone during daylight hours; expect delays of 15 minutes or less. The project should be completed in one week, weather permitting.

KDOT awarded the \$230,000 construction contract to Vance Bros. Inc. of Kansas City, Mo. Drivers are reminded to watch for the signs and flaggers, and to "Give 'Em a Brake!" at the work zone.
