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### U.S. 160 resurfacing project starts next week

The week of May 11, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) expects to begin a mill and overlay on U.S. 160 in Crawford County, weather permitting.

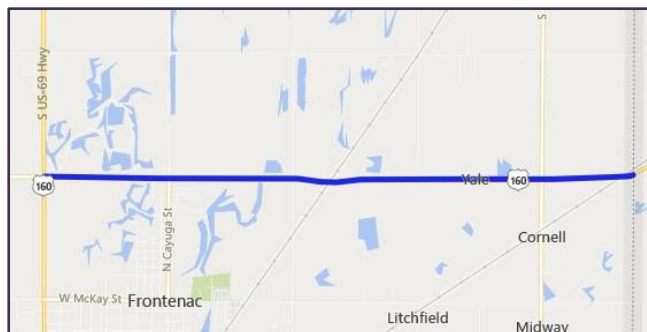
Work will start at the north U.S. 160/U.S. 69 junction and continue east to the Kansas-Missouri state line.

Flagger and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone during daylight hours; expect delays of 15 minutes or less.

The resurfacing project should be finished in a week, weather permitting.

KDOT awarded the \$819,481 construction contract to Bettis Asphalt & Construction, Inc., of Topeka.
