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Concrete patching projects to begin in Montgomery County

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin work in late May on three concrete patching projects in Montgomery County, weather permitting.

The project locations:

- U.S. 169, between the south city limits of Coffeyville and the Kansas-Oklahoma state line;
- U.S. 166 eastbound, between the west city limits of Coffeyville and the four-lane section west of the Union Pacific Railroad;
- U.S. 400, between the north and south junctions of U.S. 75/U.S. 400.

Flaggers and a pilot car will guide one-lane traffic through the work zones on U.S. 169 and U.S. 166; expect brief delays. Traffic will be reduced to one lane each direction on U.S. 400. Work on the projects should be finished in August.

KDOT awarded the \$1.2 million construction contract to Emery Sapp & Sons, Inc., Kansas City, Mo. Drivers are reminded to slow down and obey the signs and flaggers.
