K-239 resurfacing project starts Aug. 5

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin a resurfacing project on K-239 on Monday, Aug. 5, weather permitting. The road work starts east of the U.S. 69 junction and continues east for six miles to the Kansas-Missouri state line.

Project activity includes a two-inch surface recycle and a chip seal. The surface recycle process mills and heats the existing pavement, mixes it with a rejuvenating agent and paves the roadway with the recycled asphalt. Following a short cure time, a chip seal will be placed on the recycled pavement.

Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone during daylight hours; expect delays of 15 minutes or less. The road work should be completed in two weeks, weather permitting.

Dustrol, Inc., of Towanda is contractor on the \$490,000 project. Drivers are reminded to watch for the signs and flaggers, and to reduce speed in the work zone.
