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KDOT repairing concrete on U.S. 400

Beginning Tuesday, Oct. 18, and continuing for three weeks, weather permitting, Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) maintenance crews will replace concrete panels on U.S. 400 in Wilson County.

Temporary signals will direct one-lane traffic through the project work zone, which is located approximately three miles northwest of Fredonia. Traffic can expect delays of 10 minutes or less, and the speed limit will be reduced to 30 miles per hour. KDOT crews plan to work at the site between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. weekdays. The temporary traffic signals will remain active on a 24-hour/seven day weekly basis until the project is complete.
