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Guardrail improvements start on U.S. 400 in Wilson County

Monday, Feb. 15, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin a project to make guardrail improvements on U.S. 400 in Wilson County.

Guardrail will be replaced at 12 locations between the Greenwood-Wilson county line and K-47. Most of the work will take place off the highway, with minimal impacts to traffic.

KDOT awarded the \$323,780 construction contract to Bettis Asphalt & Construction, Topeka. Weather permitting, the project should be completed by late April.
