Homer Creek Bridge survey begins Sept. 28


The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin a field survey at the U.S. 54 bridge over Homer Creek on Monday, Sept. 28. The bridge is approximately four miles east of the east junction of K-99/U.S. 54.

The length of the survey is 3,500 feet on the existing highway alignment. Survey crew members will gather information for the detailed design of a proposed improvement to replace the bridge. No commitment to construction has yet been made.

KDOT expects the survey to be finished by Nov. 27. Activities include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the corridor.

A member of the survey crew will contact property owners or tenants for permission to enter private property.
