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KDOT to start surveys for bridge replacements on K-39

Starting Friday, Jan. 2, 2015, and continuing for 2½ months, weather permitting, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will conduct field surveys at the Owl Creek and Pawnee Creek bridges on K-39 in Bourbon County.

The Owl Creek Bridge is 2.14 miles east of the east K-39/K-3 junction and the Pawnee Creek Bridge is 7.43 miles east of the east K-39/K-3 junction. The surveys will be based on the existing alignment of each bridge. The approximate length of each survey is ½ mile along K-39.

The surveys are taking place to gather information necessary for the detailed designs of proposed projects to replace the bridges. Activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the corridor. A member of the survey crew will first contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Ron Shanks, P.L.S., with the consulting firm of Bartlett & West is in charge of the surveys.
