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K-7 road work to begin in August

The week of August 3, weather permitting, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) expects to start a resurfacing project on K-7 in Crawford County. The 10-mile project consists of a 2-inch surface recycle and chip seal from Cherokee north to the south city limits of Girard.

Flaggers and a pilot car will guide one-lane traffic through the work zone, with delays of 15 minutes or less expected during daylight hours. The road work should be finished by mid-September, weather permitting.

KDOT awarded Dustrol, Inc. of Towanda, Kan., the \$1 million construction contract. Bob Gudgen, construction engineer at the KDOT Pittsburg office, reminds drivers to obey the signs and flaggers and use extra caution in the work zone.
