
U.S. 400 resurfacing project to start in Greenwood County

Monday, April 22, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin a resurfacing project on U.S. 400 in Greenwood County. The 16.3-mile project starts at the Butler-Greenwood county line and continues east to the east K-99 junction.

Project activity includes surface recycling with an overlay. Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone. Expect delays of 15 minutes or less during weekday daylight hours until July.

KDOT awarded the construction contract of \$4.7 million to Pearson Construction LLC, Wichita.
