KDOT testing highway pavement July 20-23

Starting Monday, July 20, and continuing through Thursday, July 23, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will run tests of pavement strength on the following highways in Montgomery and Wilson counties:

- U.S. 75, from Independence south to the Kansas-Oklahoma state line;
- U.S. 160, from Independence west to the Montgomery-Elk county line;
- U.S. 169, from the north junction with U.S. 160 north to U.S. 400;
- K-47, from Altoona west to Fredonia.

A pilot car will guide one-lane traffic through each testing zone. Travelers can expect delays of 15 minutes or less. KDOT reminds all drivers to be alert and obey the warning signs when approaching and driving through the testing zones.
