## **KDOT testing pavement in Allen, Bourbon and Linn counties**

Starting Monday, Sept. 25, and continuing through Thursday, Sept. 28, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will run tests of pavement strength on several highways in Allen, Bourbon and Linn counties:

- U.S. 54;
- K-31, from the Anderson-Linn county line east and south to the Linn-Bourbon county line;
- K-152, from the K-7 junction east to La Cygne.

The KDOT testing crew uses a device called a falling weight deflectometer to check pavement strength. A pilot car will guide one-lane traffic through each testing work zone. Travelers can expect delays of 15 minutes or less during daylight hours. KDOT reminds all drivers to use caution and obey the signs and flaggers.
