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KDOT testing pavement in Linn, Franklin and Miami counties

CHANUTE – Starting Wednesday, July 5, and continuing through Friday, July 7, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will run tests of pavement strength on sections of several highways in Linn, Franklin and Miami counties:

- K-31, east of Kincaid and north of Mapleton;
- K-152, from the K-7 junction east to La Cygne;
- U.S. 169, from Greeley north to the K-7 junction.

The KDOT testing crew uses a device called a falling weight deflectometer to check pavement strength. A pilot car will guide one-lane traffic through each testing work zone. Travelers can expect delays of 15 minutes or less during daylight hours. KDOT reminds all drivers to use caution and obey the signs and flaggers at testing zones.
