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KDOT to start U.S. 75 project in late spring

In late May or early June the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) expects to begin a 17-mile mill and resurfacing project on U.S. 75 from Burlington north to the Coffey-Osage county line.

The project includes work on U.S. 75 inside the city of Burlington. The contractor, Chester Bross Construction of Hannibal, Mo., will first replace the concrete pavement at the intersection of U.S. 75 and Neosho Street. At that location traffic will be reduced to one lane through the work zone with a temporary traffic signal. North of Hudson Street in Burlington, traffic will be reduced to one lane while the roadway is milled and resurfaced.

The contractor will complete work in Burlington before continuing north on U.S. 75. Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone between Burlington and the Coffey-Osage county line. Traveler delays of 15 minutes or less can be expected during daylight hours, with a driving lane with restriction of 11 feet.
