K-4 resurfacing project starts

The Kansas Department of Transportation expects a resurfacing project on K-4 in Scott and Lane counties to begin by Tuesday, July 21. The project runs from the K-4/U.S. 83 junction in Scott County to the K-4/K-23 junction in Lane County.

During construction, traffic will be limited to one lane through the work zone, guided by a pilot car. Drivers can expect delays of 15 minutes or less. The Kansas DOT urges drivers to be alert, pay attention to all work zone warning signs, slow down when approaching a work zone and be prepared to stop.

Venture Corporation of Great Bend is the primary contractor on this preservation project, which is tied to work on K-96 in Lane County, with a combined contract cost of approximately \$5.6 million. KDOT expects work on this project to be completed by mid-September, depending on weather.
