K-25 resurfacing project set for Rawlins County

The Kansas Department of Transportation will begin work on a resurfacing project on a portion of K-25 in Rawlins County the week of June 26. Crews will be working on a 13-mile stretch from the U.S. 36 junction to the Nebraska border.

Project work includes a 2-inch heat scarification to improve the surface profile, followed by application of a chip seal. Traffic will be reduced to one lane with a 12-foot width restriction and controlled by flaggers and a pilot car during daylight hours. Minor delays not exceeding 15 minutes should be expected. KDOT reminds motorists to be alert, obey the warning signs and "Give 'em a Brake!" when approaching and driving through work zones.

Bettis Asphalt and Construction of Topeka is the primary contractor for the project with a total contract cost of \$766,000. Work is expected to be completed by the end of July, weather permitting.
