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
Resurfacing on K-18 and K-252 in Lincoln County to begin

Beginning Monday, June 22, the Kansas Department of Transportation will begin a surface recycle and chip seal on K-18 and K-252 in Lincoln County. Work on K-18 will occur between the east city limits of Lincoln and the Lincoln/Ottawa County line. Work on K-252 will begin at K-18 and continue south to the city of Beverly.

Construction will occur during daylight hours and traffic will be reduced to one 11-foot lane following a pilot car through the work zone. Drivers should be prepared for a delay of up to 15 minutes and plan extra time in their travel schedules.

The prime contractor for this \$1.2 million project is Dustrol Inc. of Towanda. The contractor has scheduled this project to be completed by August, weather permitting.
