Resurfacing on U.S. 24 and K-194 begins Friday in Cloud County

On Friday, August 21, the Kansas Department of Transportation will begin a mill and overlay on U.S. 24 and K-194 in Cloud County. Work on U.S. 24 will extend from the Mitchell/Cloud County line east 15.6 miles to the U.S. 81 junction. Work on K-194 will extend from U.S. 24 south 1.6 miles to the town of Simpson.

Construction will take place Monday through Friday with occasional Saturday work during daylight hours. Traffic will be reduced to one 12-foot lane following a pilot car through the work zone. Drivers should be prepared for a delay of up to 15 minutes and plan extra time in their travel schedules.

Hall Brothers Inc. of Marysville is the prime contractor and has scheduled this \$2.5 million project to be completed by November, weather permitting.
