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Survey to begin Sept. 21 on U.S. 24 in Cloud County

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin a field survey on Monday, Sept. 21, for the detailed design of proposed bridge improvements on U.S. 24 in Cloud County.

The two locations being surveyed are for the Lost Creek Bridge, .53 mile east of the Cloud/Mitchell county line and for the Cris Creek Bridge, 7.41 miles east of the Cloud/Mitchell county line.

The survey will take place on the existing highway alignment.

KDOT expects the survey work to last five weeks. Activities include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the corridor.

A member of the survey crew will contact property owners or tenants for permission to enter private property.
