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Survey Scheduled for K-177 in Chase County

Surveyors will soon be conducting work on K-177 in order to gather information necessary for the detailed design of a proposed bridge replacement over Fox Creek in Chase County. The survey will take place along a .8 mile stretch of K-177 5.7 miles north of the US-50/K-177 Interchange. The survey is scheduled to begin Monday, October 5, 2015 and will be completed by the end of October weather permitting.

A member of the survey crew will first contact property owners and/or tenants for permission prior to entering private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
