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Pavement patching, resurfacing begins June 1 in Dickinson County

Beginning Wednesday, June 1, the Kansas Department of Transportation will begin patching and resurfacing the westbound lanes and shoulders of I-70 in Dickinson County. Work on I-70 will begin at mile marker 289, just west of the Geary/Dickinson County line, and continue west about three miles to mile marker 286, just east of Chapman Creek.

Westbound traffic on I-70 will be reduced to one 16-foot lane at a reduced speed through the work zone. Drivers should expect minimal delays, not exceeding five minutes.

APAC-Kansas Inc. Shears Division of Hutchinson is the prime contractor and has scheduled this \$1.6 million project to be completed in August, weather permitting.
