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K-20 Resurfacing Project Begins in Brown County

On **Tuesday, July 16**, a resurfacing project will begin on a 10.43-mile stretch of K-20 from the west junction of U.S. 75 to the west city limits of Horton in Brown County. Project work includes a 2-inch surface mill and a 2-inch asphalt overlay on mainline lanes and rocking of the adjacent shoulders. Work will take place during daylight hours, Monday through Friday, with some occasional Saturday work. The work will be coordinated so that all lanes will be opened to traffic by one-half before sunset.

Beginning on **Tuesday, July 16**, eastbound and westbound K-20 will be reduced to one lane for resurfacing work as crews begin work at the west junction of U.S. 75 and move east. Traffic will be reduced to one lane for both directions along with intermittent closures of adjacent cross roads during the project work hours.

Traffic will be directed through the project work zone via a pilot car and flagger operation. Drivers should expect delays of up to 15 minutes maximum and are encouraged to use alternate routes, if possible. There will be an 11-foot lane width restriction and a posted speed limit of 40 mph through the work zone except in areas where workers are located, in these locations the posted speed limit will be reduced to 20 mph. No large structures or superloads will be allowed through the project work zone. Uneven lane signs will be used when needed to guide traffic through the project.

The Kansas Department of Transportation urges all motorists to be alert, obey the warning signs, and “Give ‘Em a Brake!” when approaching and driving through the project work zone.

Bettis Asphalt & Construction Inc. (Topeka, KS) is the primary contractor on this resurfacing project with a total contract cost of \$927,292. **Overall project work is scheduled to be completed in early September 2013, weather permitting.**
