Bridge repair work in Lyon County on K-99 begins July 20

Crews will be patching and overlaying the bridge on K-99 at mile marker 126.6 near the K-99/U.S. 56 junction in Lyon County beginning Monday, July 20, weather permitting. The project is expected to be completed Sept. 1, according to the Kansas Department of Transportation.

The southbound lane and shoulder will close while crews perform repairs. Once it's complete, the northbound lane will close. Most of the work will take place during the day, however some may go into the night. Flaggers will direct traffic to follow a pilot car through the construction area. Motorists should expect delays and plan accordingly.

Work includes patching, multi-polymer overlay and substructure waterproofing. Bettis Asphalt & Construction of Topeka is the contractor on the \$168,000 project.
