Survey for proposed replacement of Marshall County bridge

A field survey is expected to begin Monday, Nov. 16 for the proposed replacement of Bridge #035 over Jim Creek in Marshall County.


The proposed replacement is located 4.26 miles north of the Pottawatomie County line on K-99.

The survey is to gather information that is necessary for the detailed design of the bridge and expected completion is Feb. 1, 2021.

Johnny Yackle, P.S., Field Survey Project Manager, HDR, will be in charge of this survey for the Kansas Department of Transportation.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
