Transmission line installation on U.S. 75 in Jackson County Saturday

A transmission line installation project on U.S. 75 in Jackson County to begin, Saturday, June 6 and is expected to be complete, Monday, June 8, according to the Kansas Department of Transportation.

A high voltage overhead transmission line will be installed over U.S. 75, north of Holton, at approximately mile marker 193. Work will occur during daylight hours, weather permitting.

Traffic will be controlled using a pilot car operation, lane closure, signage and traffic cones. Drivers should expect delays and are advised to find alternate routes.
