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Survey for proposed intersection improvements in Riley County

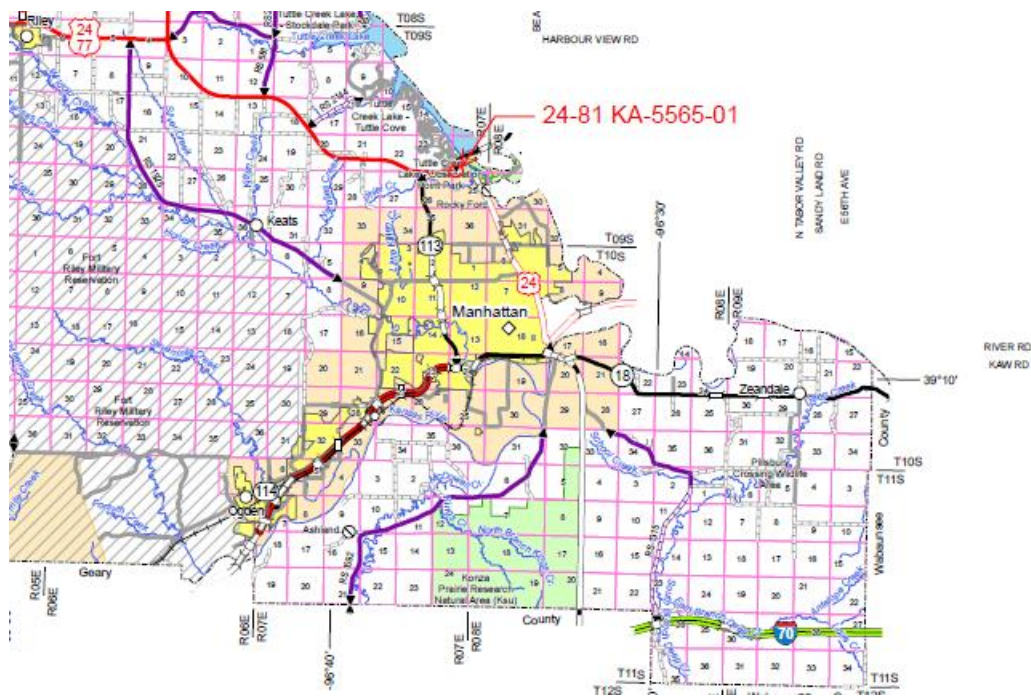
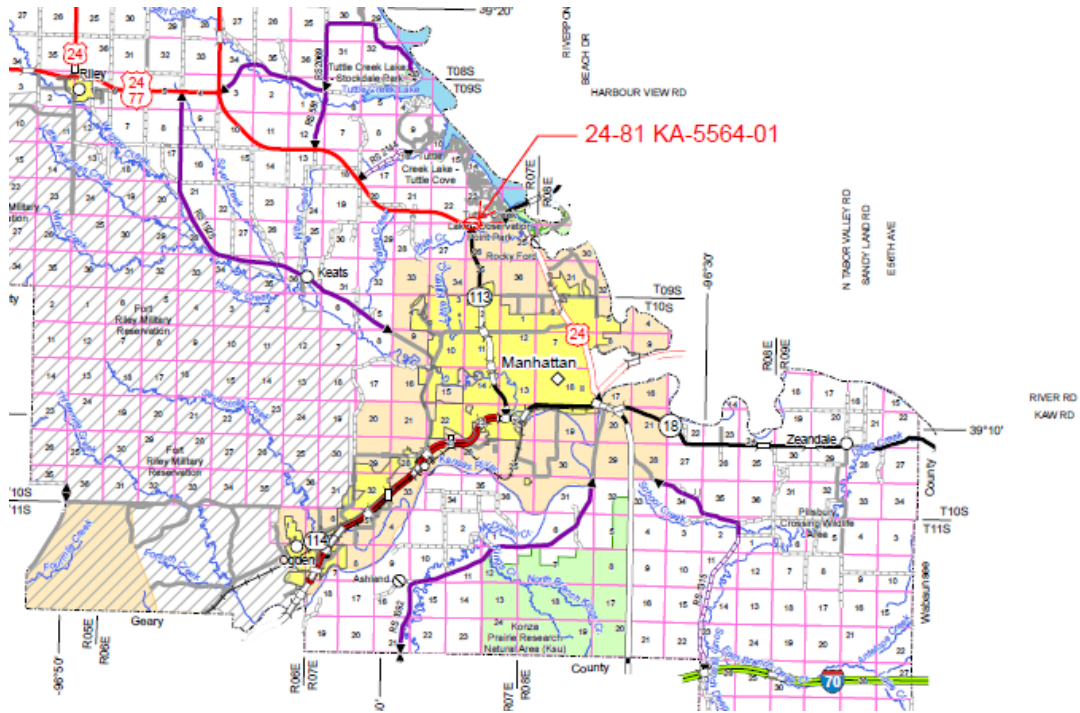
The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) to begin field surveys, Monday, Feb. 22, for proposed intersection improvements at the U.S. 24/K-113 junction and at the U.S. 24/K-13 junction in Riley County.

The survey is to gather information that is necessary for the detailed design of the proposed improvements and is estimated to be completed by April 15, 2021.

Caleb Rubash, P.S., Field Survey Project Manager, Garber Surveying, will be in charge of this survey for KDOT.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
