U.S. 36 overlay and milling work begins in Nemaha County

Overlay and milling work on the eastbound and westbound lanes of U.S. 36 began today in Nemaha County. The work covers approximately 14 miles, from the U.S. 36/K-63 junction in Seneca to Acord Road, and is expected to be completed by late June, weather permitting.

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, traffic will be restricted to one lane in the work zone and will be directed by a pilot car, flaggers, signs and cones. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes and add extra time in their travel schedules.

Work will take place Monday through Saturday, during daytime hours. Hall Brothers, Inc., of Marysville is the contractor on the \$2 million project.
