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K-9 mill and overlay project begins July 26 in Marshall County


A mill and overlay project on K-9 in Marshall County is scheduled to begin Monday, July 26, weather permitting. The work will cover approximately 12.5 miles, from the K-9/U.S. 77 junction to the K-9/K-99 junction in Frankfort.

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, traffic will be restricted to one lane in the work zone and will be directed by a pilot car, flaggers, signs and cones. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes.

Work will take place Monday through Friday, during daylight hours, and is expected to be complete by late August, weather permitting.

Hall Brothers, Inc., of Marysville is the contractor on the \$1.7 million project.
