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Survey for proposed bridge replacement to begin in Nemaha County

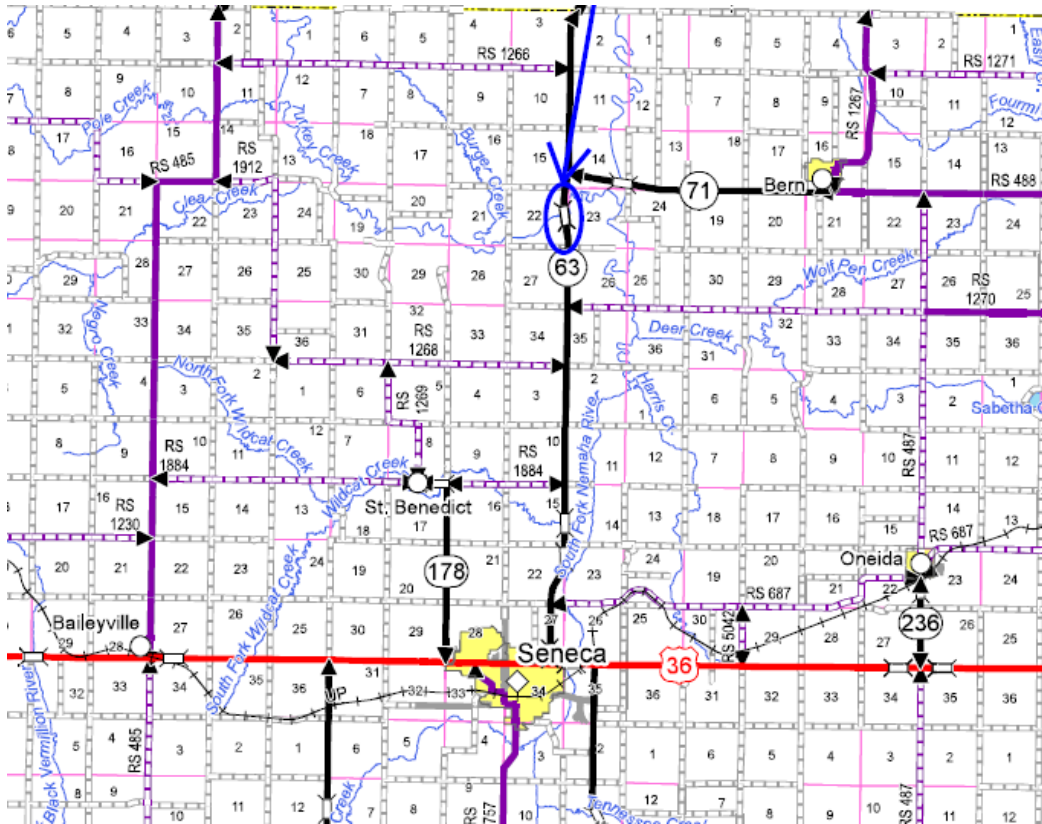
The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will conduct a field survey for a proposed bridge replacement of the Turkey Creek Bridge located on K-63, approximately one mile south of the K-63/K-71 junction in Nemaha County.

The survey is to gather information that is necessary for the detailed design of the proposed improvement. It will begin on or about Tuesday, May 25, and is estimated to be completed by June 25.

Joseph Bowen, P.S., Field Survey Project Manager, Bureau of Right of Way, will oversee this survey for KDOT.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
