

K-16 closure planned in Jackson County

A section of K-16 in Jackson County will be closed on Thursday, Sept. 1, from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., weather permitting, while maintenance crews replace crossroad pipe in the area.

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, K-16 will be closed to through traffic between K-63 and K-62. No detours will be posted, and motorists will need to use alternate routes.
