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K-99 resurfacing project scheduled in Wabaunsee County

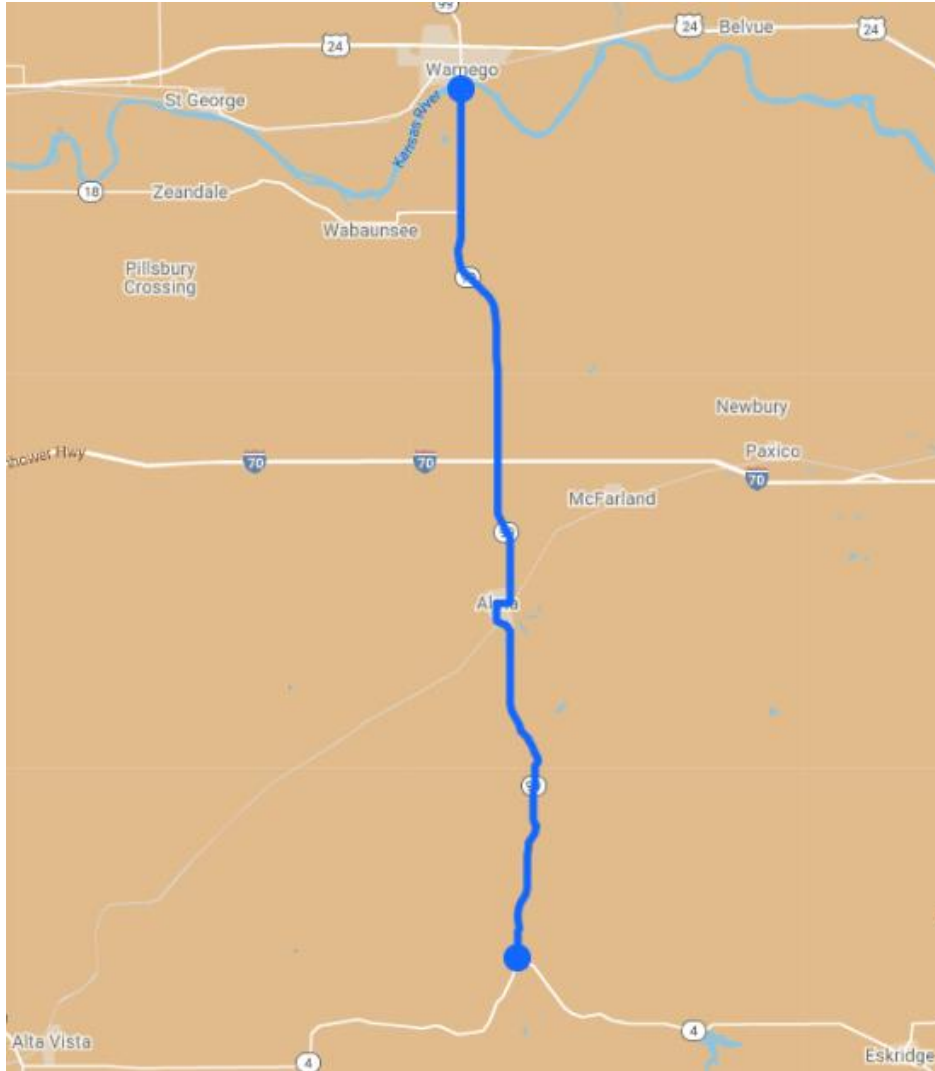
A milling and overlay project is scheduled to begin on K-99 in Wabaunsee County on Tuesday, Aug. 30, weather permitting. Work will cover approximately 22 miles, from the K-99/K-4 junction to the Wabaunsee/Pottawatomie county line, just south of Wamego. The City of Alma and the ongoing K-99 realignment project are not included.

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, the contractor will begin at the county line and work south to I-70. Once complete, work will begin at the K-4 junction and progress north to I-70. Traffic will be restricted to one lane in the work zone and will be directed by a pilot car, flaggers, signs and cones. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes.

Work will take place Monday through Friday, and Saturdays as needed, during daylight hours. Estimated completion is early November.

Shilling Construction Co., of Manhattan, is the contractor on the \$3.4 million project.
