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Milling and overlay project underway on K-192 in Jefferson and Leavenworth counties

Milling and overlay work is underway on K-192, from U.S. 59 to U.S. 73, in Jefferson and Leavenworth counties.

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) pavement improvement project includes milling and asphalt overlay and work on the shoulder edge.

Eastbound and westbound K-192 traffic will be restricted to one lane and directed by a pilot car, flaggers, signs and cones.


Motorists should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes and allow for extra time in travel schedules.

Project work will occur Monday to Saturday, from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., and is expected to be completed in mid-August.

Herzog Contracting of St. Joseph, Mo., is the contractor for the \$2.6 million project.
