U.S. 56, K-78 project to begin in Lyon County

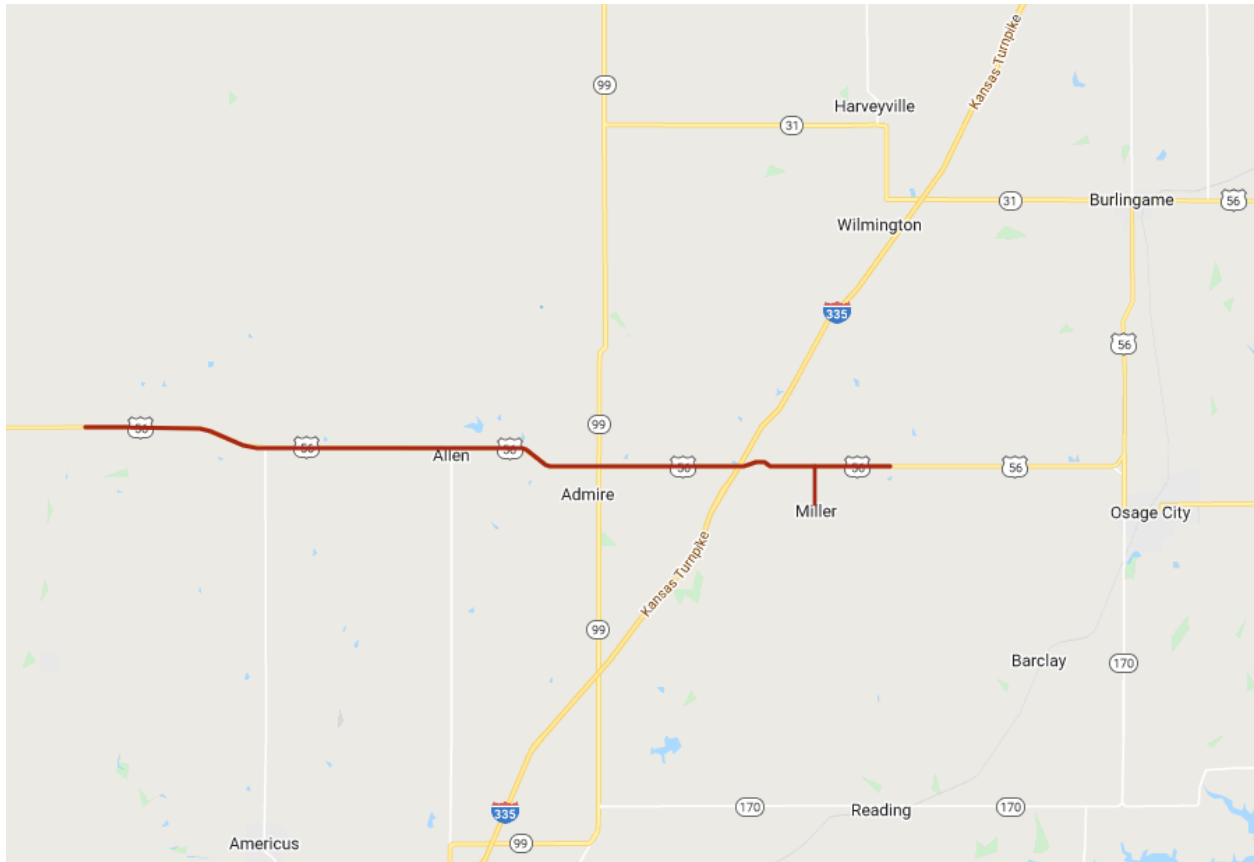
A milling and overlay project is scheduled to begin Monday, April 4, in Lyon County. The work will cover approximately 22 miles of U.S. 56, from the Morris County line to the Osage County line. K-78, from U.S. 56 to Miller, is also included in the project.

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, traffic will be restricted to one lane in the work zone and will be directed by a pilot car, flaggers, signs, and cones. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes and add extra time in their travel schedules.

Work will occur Monday through Friday, and Saturday as needed, during daylight hours. The project is expected to be complete by late May, weather permitting.

Shilling Construction Co., of Manhattan, is the contractor on the \$3.25 million project.
