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## **K-13 resurfacing project scheduled to begin Monday**

A Kansas Department of Transportation mill and overlay project is scheduled to begin on K-13 on Monday, April 1. The project covers approximately 15 miles of K-13, starting at the U.S. 24 junction in Riley County to the K-16 junction in Pottawatomie County.


Traffic will be reduced to one lane and directed by a pilot car and flaggers when crews are working. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes.

A 13-foot width restriction will also be in effect.

Work will take place Monday through Friday during daylight hours.

Shilling Construction Co., of Manhattan, is the contractor on the \$3.9 million project, which is expected to be complete by mid-June, conditions permitting.
