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Lane and ramp closures in Topeka

The ongoing core sampling project on several bridge decks along I-70, has moved to the westbound lanes, in downtown Topeka, according to the Kansas Department of Transportation. Work will occur from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and is expected to be complete in approximately 15 days, weather permitting.

Core drilling is occurring on the Adams Street/BNSF/Shunganunga Creek Bridge, the Polk Quincy Viaduct, the Third Street Bridge and the Fourth Street Bridge.


The ramp on westbound I-70 at Eighth Street will be closed on Wednesday, May 27, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. to remove a dead tree.

The on/off ramps will be closed periodically on U.S. 24, from Northwest Rochester Road, west to Northwest Menoken Road, as part of the ongoing mill and overlay project. Ramp closures will occur May 26 to May 29, during daylight hours. This project is expected to be complete at the end of June.

There will be intermittent lane closures as needed and traffic will be controlled using arrow boards, digital message signs and traffic cones. Drivers should expect delays.
