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Overlay work on K-4 begins May 3


Overlay work on the northbound and southbound lanes of K-4 is scheduled to begin on Monday, May 3, weather permitting. The work will cover approximately 1.25 miles, from just north of the S.E. 6th Street ramps to I-70 in Shawnee County.

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, work will include the on and off ramps for 6th Street and I-70 and will alternate between the left and right lanes throughout the project. Traffic will be restricted to one lane in the work zone and will be directed by a pilot car, flaggers, signs and cones. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes and add extra time in their travel schedules.

Work will take place Monday through Saturday, beginning 30 minutes after sunrise until 30 minutes before sunset. The project is expected to be completed by early June.

Bettis Asphalt & Construction, Inc. of Topeka is the contractor on the \$1.8 million project.
