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Overlay project resumes in Shawnee, Osage counties

An overlay project on southbound U.S. 75 is scheduled to resume today, April 28, in Shawnee and Osage counties.

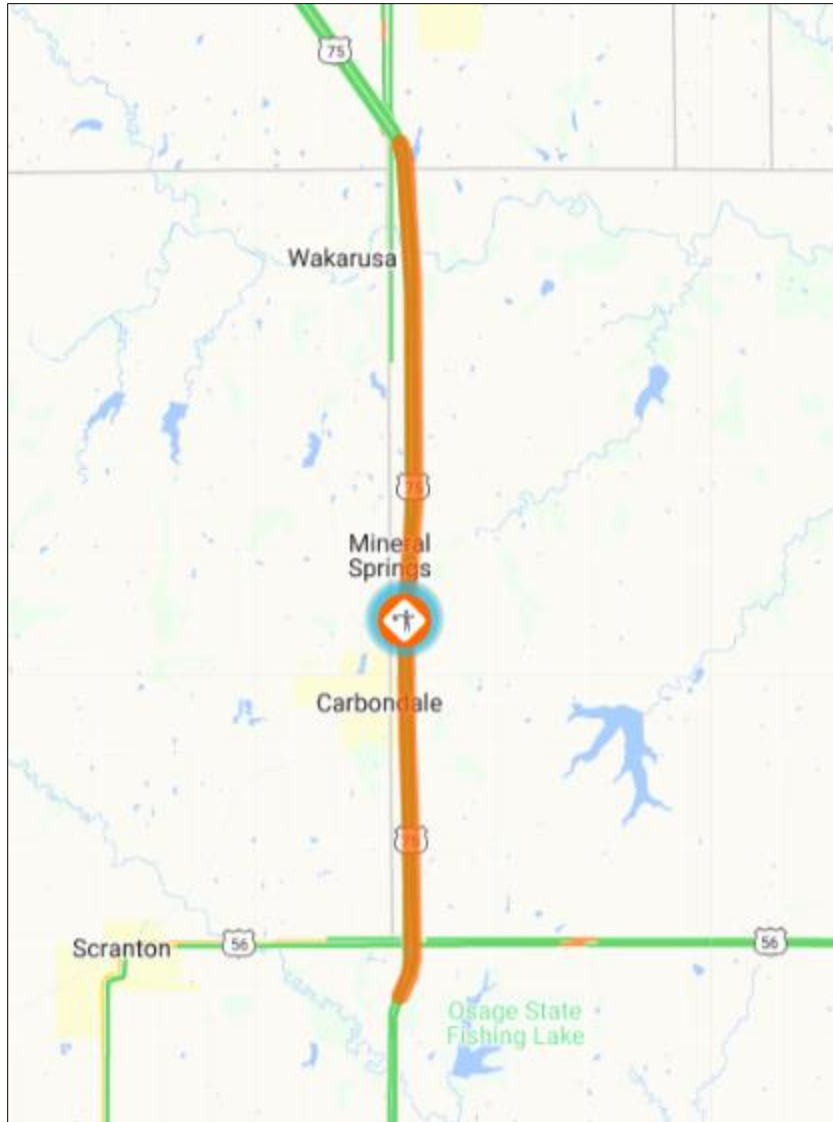
According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, southbound U.S. 75 will be restricted to one lane from Southwest Topeka Boulevard to just south of the U.S. 75/U.S. 56 intersection in Osage County.

On- and off-ramps along the route are included in the project. Ramp closures will be one day or less, and information will be posted on message boards. Drivers should prepare for slow-moving traffic through the area.

Work will take place Monday through Saturday, during daylight hours, and is expected to be complete by early June, weather permitting.
