Bridge repair to reduce eastbound K-10 starting March 14

Repair work on the eastbound K-10 bridge over the Wakarusa River will begin Monday, March 15, weather permitting. The work will require a lane reduction at this location, according to the Kansas Department of Transportation.

The eastbound K-10 bridge in Douglas County is located about one mile west of Eudora. Motorists should expect some delays in this area. During morning and afternoon rush hours these delays could be up to 15 minutes, and drivers should add extra time to their travel schedules. Drivers should be prepared for slow-moving traffic and use extra caution through the work zone.

The bridge work is scheduled to be completed by August. PCiRoads of Saint Michael, Minn., is the prime contractor on the \$1.4 million project.
