At its April 26, 2011 Board of Directors meeting, the Mid-America Regional Council amended the *FFY 2010-2014 Transportation Improvement Program* for the Kansas City Metropolitan Region. This 2011 second quarter amendment consists of 18 projects: 8 Kansas and 10 Missouri. Details of specific funding and other information are included in the project listing of the amendment and the project index list provides the total number of projects by project type (new, modified or deleted), state, and TIP number. The amendment and index lists are posted on the MARC website at http://www.marc.org/transportation/tip/archives.htm and are printable for filing.

MARC's Public Involvement Plan requires that proposed amendments to the *TIP* be released for public review and comment prior to adoption by the MARC Board of Directors. One comment from the general public was received during the public comment period. The comment and a response from MARC are attached for your review.

This amendment is financially constrained and maintains the financial feasibility of the FFY 2010-2014 TIP.

Since the MARC TIP is incorporated by reference, without modification, into the statewide transportation improvement program (STIP), the MARC TIP represents the most current listing of projects within the boundaries of the Kansas City metropolitan planning area and should be the basis for comparison of projects listed in the amendment. The MARC TIP is available for review online at: http://www.marc.org/transportation/tip.htm.

We very much appreciate the recent incorporation of bicycle, pedestrian, and related issues into MARC's Transportation Outlook 2040 through the incorporation of Complete Streets principles. We believe this will greatly benefit the metro area in the coming years, and we have been holding out this recently adopted policy as a model for other planning organizations across Missouri and across the nation to follow.

The TIP looks like it has several excellent projects dealing with bicycle and pedestrian facilities.

My specific comment is about the other projects--the ordinary road, interchange, and bridge type projects.

I know that several of these incorporate bicycle and pedestrian accommodation at some level--some of them at very good levels.

I would guess that others may incorporate little or no bicycle or pedestrian accommodation at all.

It would be very helpful if the TIP and other project summary information, would give more specific information about what bicycle, pedestrian, transit, and other similar considerations are addressed in the projects, and in what way.

Does the project include sidewalks, bicycle lanes, paths, crosswalks, walkways over bridges, shoulders, wide curb lanes to accommodate bicycling, pedestrian signals and phases at intersections? Will the signal timing for pedestrian phases be the minimum required under AASHTO standards or higher than the minimum--which is often the case if schools, day care centers, senior centers, senior housing, or the like is in the area?

What is the "Complete Streets Level of Service" for the proposed project--or the level of service for motorists, bicyclists, pedestrians, an so on?

All those would be very helpful in getting an overview of how these projects are helping--or hurting--in our efforts to make a more bicyclable and walking metropolitan area.

Thanks so much for considering these comments.

As part of that process, MARC will work with project sponsors to obtain additional details surrounding the scope of work for each project and to convey information in a manner that is both meaningful and useful for all users of the TIP.

MARC thanks you for your comments regarding the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program and looks forward to your continued involvement in the regional transportation planning process.

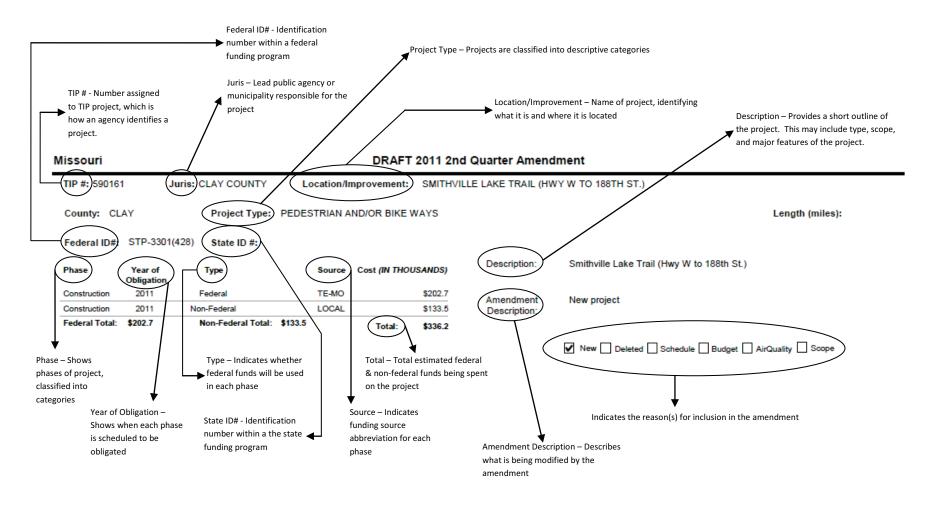
