As requested by your September 12th, 2011 letter, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have reviewed the proposed Amendment #17 to the FY 2011-2014 Kansas Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

Based on our review, we find that this STIP Amendment is based on a statewide transportation planning process that substantially meets the requirements of 23 U.S.C. 134 and 135, 49 U.S.C. 5303 and 5304, and 23 CFR 450. We also find that the referenced revisions to the metropolitan Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) are consistent with the metropolitan transportation plans produced by the continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation process carried out by the Metropolitan Planning Organizations, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT), and the public transportation operators in accordance with 23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303.

This STIP Amendment is hereby approved.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Topeka Planning Organization (MTPO) is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to carry out the Continuing, Cooperative and Comprehensive planning program (3C process), including transportation planning; and,

WHEREAS, the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) of the MPO identifies its project programming objectives, the functional and financial responsibilities of all participating entities, and projects designed to address regional mobility issues raised and discussed in the MPO's Long Range Transportation Plan; and,

WHEREAS, a Transportation Improvement Program for the Topeka Area is required to be adopted at least once every four years, and must be amended when necessary, in accordance with the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) and related laws and regulations as well as MTPO adopted policies.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with the provisions of 23 CFR Part 450.212(b), the Kansas Department of Transportation and the Metropolitan Topeka Planning Organization hereby agree that the public involvement activities carried out in response to the metropolitan planning requirements in 23 CFR 450.322(c) or 23 CFR 450.324(c) satisfy the public involvement requirements to add this TIP amendment into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP); and that the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program for the Topeka Area be amended to include the following Projects-

#K-7431-01 (KDOT) US-24 Hwy; Countryside Rd. east to existing 4-lanes. Bridge replacement over UPRR Topeka Blvd., with intersection improvements.

TIP Amendment #3

2011-2014 TIP Project # K-7431-01 (KDOT) US-24 Hwy; Countryside Rd. east to existing 4-lanes. Bridge Replacement over UPRR Topeka Blvd. Intersection Improvements—Attached please find the proposed TIP amendment #3 to the 2011-2014 TIP. This is an amendment to an existing TIP project, which now includes the 2011 "Utility" and "Construction" phases of the proposed project. The Utility costs will be 829K and the Construction costs will be 44,233K. All costs are State costs, utilizing advance construction which will be converted to BRF funding in 2016. Specifically, the project entails reconstruction of US-24 into a four lane freeway, and replacing the bridge over the UPRR with twin bridges and building an interchange for Menoken Rd. All phases are now active. The project has been approved for letting as part of TWORKS Expansion and Modernization Program. The corresponding fiscal constraint table and project table are attached
